

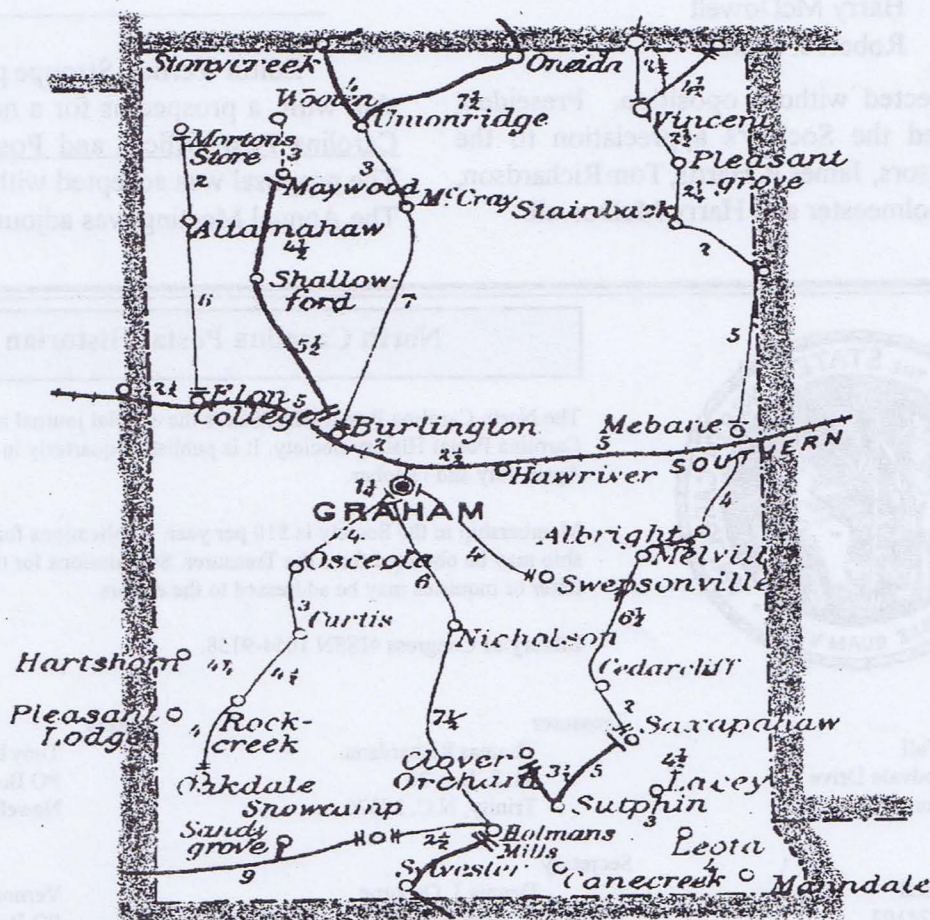
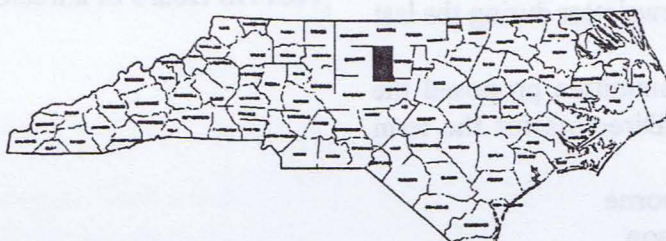
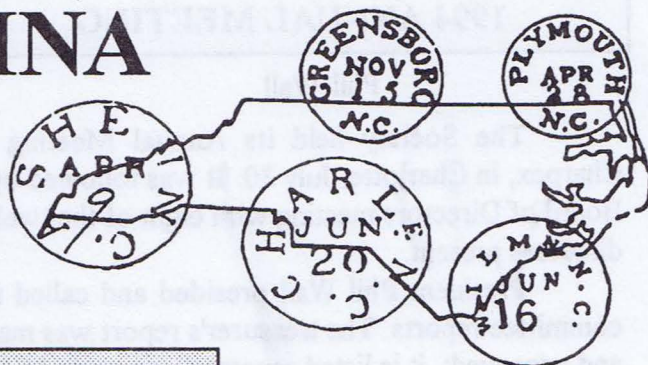

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NEWSLETTER BECOMES THE NORTH CAROLINA POSTAL HISTORIAN

After 49 editions of the NCPHS Newsletter, the 50th, and subsequent editions of the Journal of the North Carolina Postal History Society, will be known as the North Carolina Postal Historian.

This action was taken by the Board of Directors of the Society at the 1994 Annual Meeting. The masthead of this issue of the journal reflects the new name. The board's opinion was that the term "Newsletter" did not fully reflect the content of the journal, therefore, the change.

WORK BEGINS ON A NEW PUBLICATION, NORTH CAROLINA POST OFFICES AND POSTMASTERS, 1778-1962

The postal historians of North Carolina have had a diverse set of publications from which they derived their research. There has been the many government publications going back before 1800. In the last twenty years we have used The Post Office Catalog by Perkinson & Johnson, Illustrated North Carolina Postal Markings, and more recently North Carolina Post Offices and Postmasters, 1860-66 as well as the new Postal Markings of the North Carolina Railroads by Crumbley.

A large untapped amount of unpublished information has existed on microfilm, Records of Appointments of Postmasters in the U.S. from the Government Printing Office. The task of transcribing these original documents was undertaken independently by Del R. Frazier and Garland Stout, both deceased.

The NCPHS has obtained the work of both of these researchers and will expand upon them to publish The Post Offices and Postmasters of North Carolina, 1778-1962. Added to the listing will be information from seven major sources plus dozens of government documents and publications.

The compilation of sources will be illustrated in the manner of the last Society publication, Postal Markings of the North Carolina Railroads. The illustrations of the markings, whether manuscript or handstamp will be reproduced, cleaned and restored.

The quantity of markings during the nearly two centuries are in the many thousands, much more than the editors can manage, therefore, we will concentrate on manuscript and handstamp markings up to the machine marking period, approximately the turn of the century. Even with these restrictions, the illustrated markings should total more than 2,000.

The format is shown in the following pages. Alamance County was selected to be used on a trial basis. The first page for each county, see page 5, will have a state map indicating the location of the county within the state and a postal route map of 1910. The post offices will be listed alphabetically within the 100 counties. The text information will give the date of origin; county of origin, if different; postmaster's name and date of taking office; all changes in the office; date of discontinuance and disposition of mail and/or papers.

The illustrations will be placed next to or near the postmaster who used the marking. Color(s) of the markings and their periods of use will be listed, and where there are multiple markings used, type numbers will be assigned. See pages 6 through 14.

To help the researcher, two cross references will be provided: post office to county and postmaster to post office.

This enormous effort is expected to take approximately 1,600 pages. It will be necessary to publish it in three or four volumes. A suggested publication date is late 1997 or 1998.

The NCPHS members who have volunteered for editing tasks are: Ruth Wetmore, Tom Richardson, Bob Stets, Tony Crumbley and Vernon Stroupe. New member Bob Garrison will proof-read and Tony Crumbley will handle printing, sales and distribution. Help will be needed in computer restoration of the markings and one or two computer programs are available for PC's.

The remaining members of NCPHS will not be left out of the fun. On page 4 is a flow chart of the tasks. In a box in the upper right is the label "Markings in Member Collections". This is YOU! We need good quality photocopies of all markings in your collection which are not shown, or, are different from the markings in Illustrated North Carolina Postal Markings, 1777-1865, especially those between 1865 and 1899. 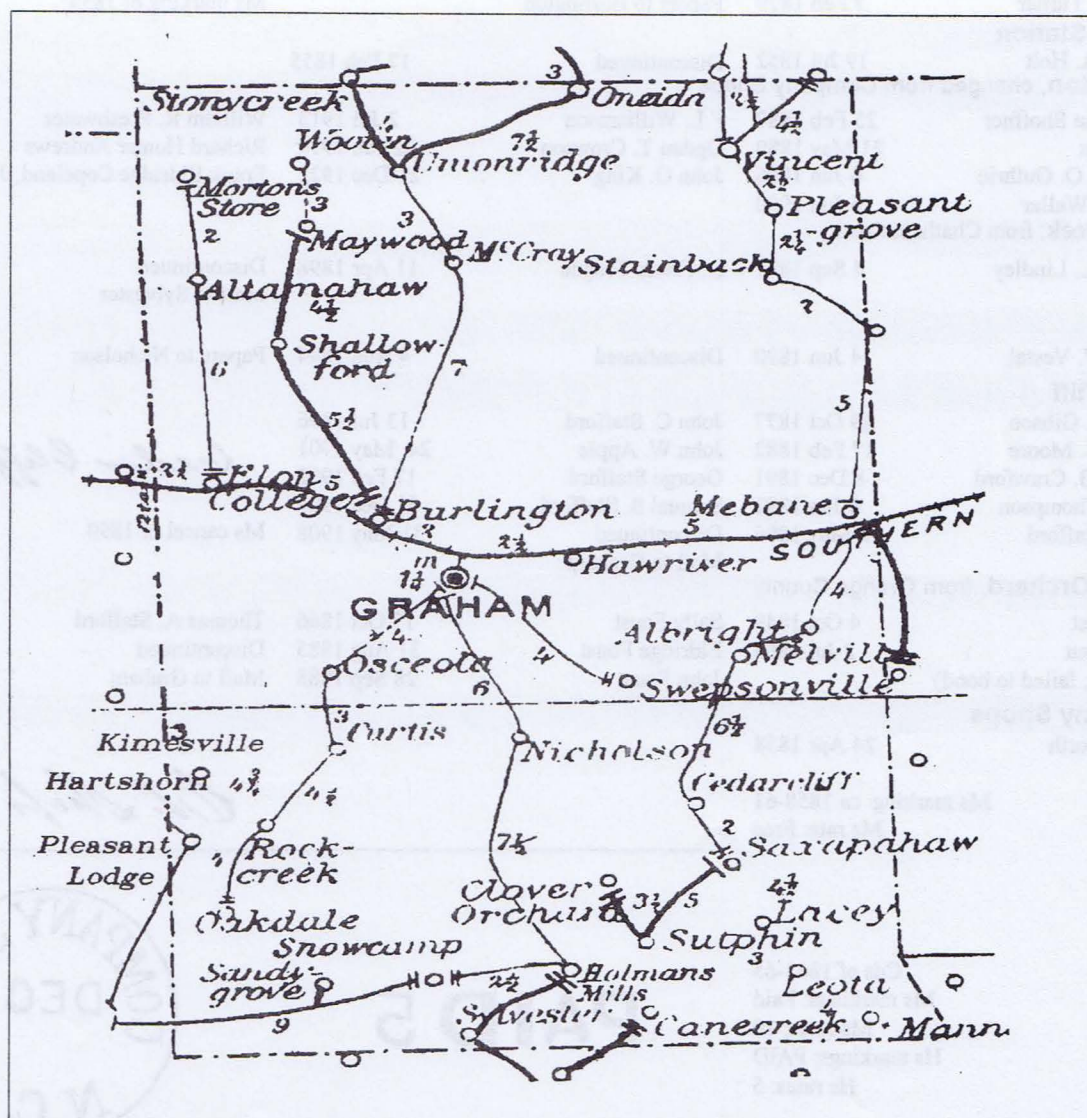
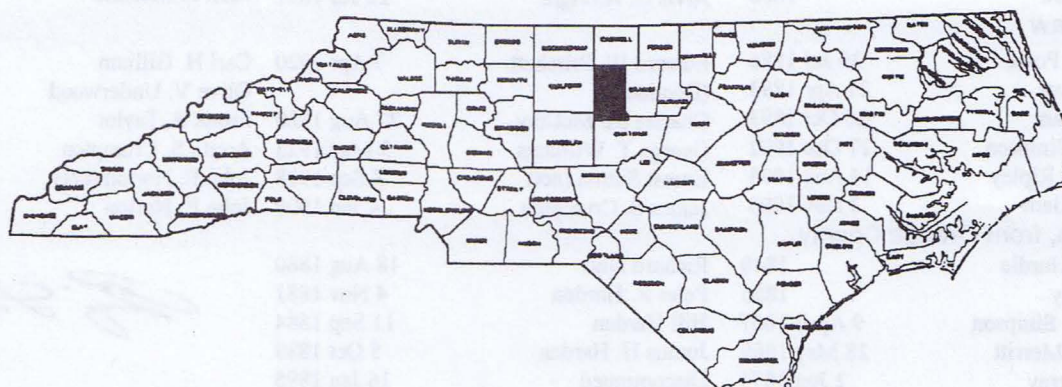

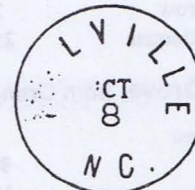

TWO NEW NORTH CAROLINA FANCY CANCELS

Nothing is more fun than rooting through a box of covers and turning up something unexpected. It is particularly nice to turn up a new fancy cancel. As attractive and desirable as these markings are, little is known about their origin and existence.

While there are books on subject, the best listing of North Carolina fancy cancels appeared in Ken Schoolmeester's article in this publication in the Winter 1989 issue. Ken's article lists around 120 post offices in the state which are known to have used fancy cancels.

Because of the nature of the marking device, most being carved from wood or a cork, few have survived today. Typically they wore out quickly so they were only used for a short time.

Ridgeway, in Warren County is known to have used five different fancy cancels in the years between 1867 and 1902. Ken listed them as a Negative Star (1879), Propeller (1867), "R" (1877), Star Burst (1902) and a Star in Circle in 1894. Shown in Fig. 1. is a new one, that I called a spider on initially seeing it on a registered letter from 1897. It could be the same as the Star Burst Schoolmeester lists in 1902.

The second one, Fig. 2, I turned up is a maltese cross cancel on a letter from Washington, N.C. on a green U82 embossed cover which was issued in the 1870-71 time frame. There was no date on the cover.

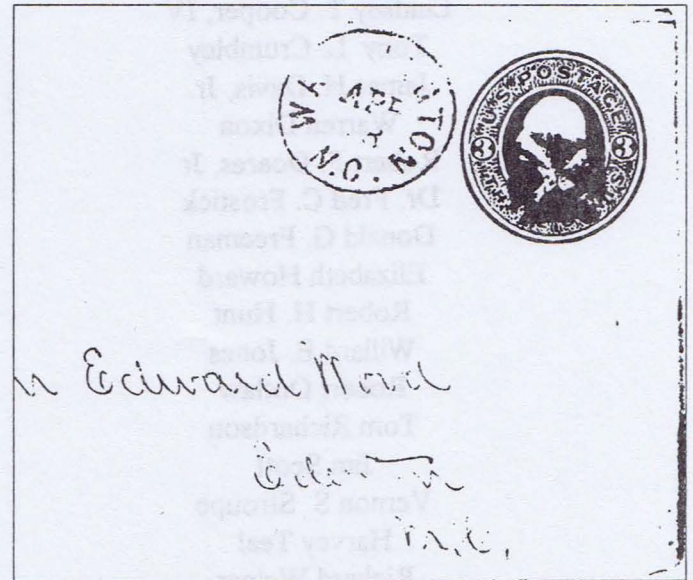
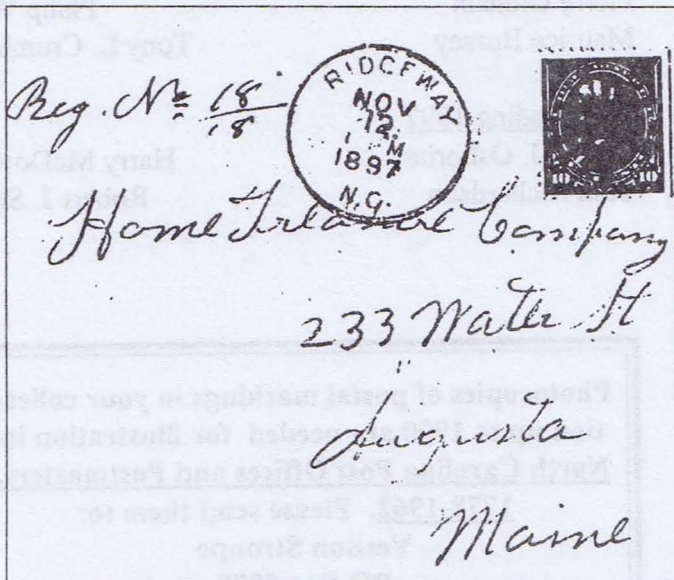
