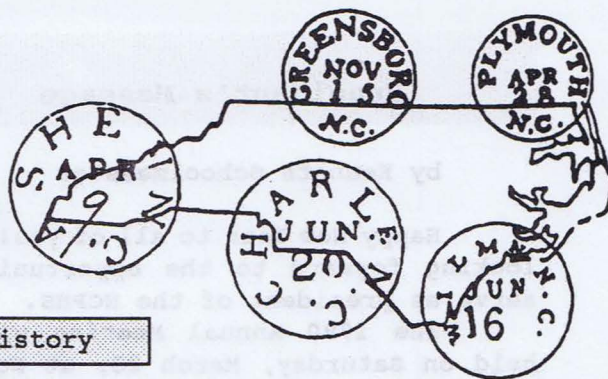

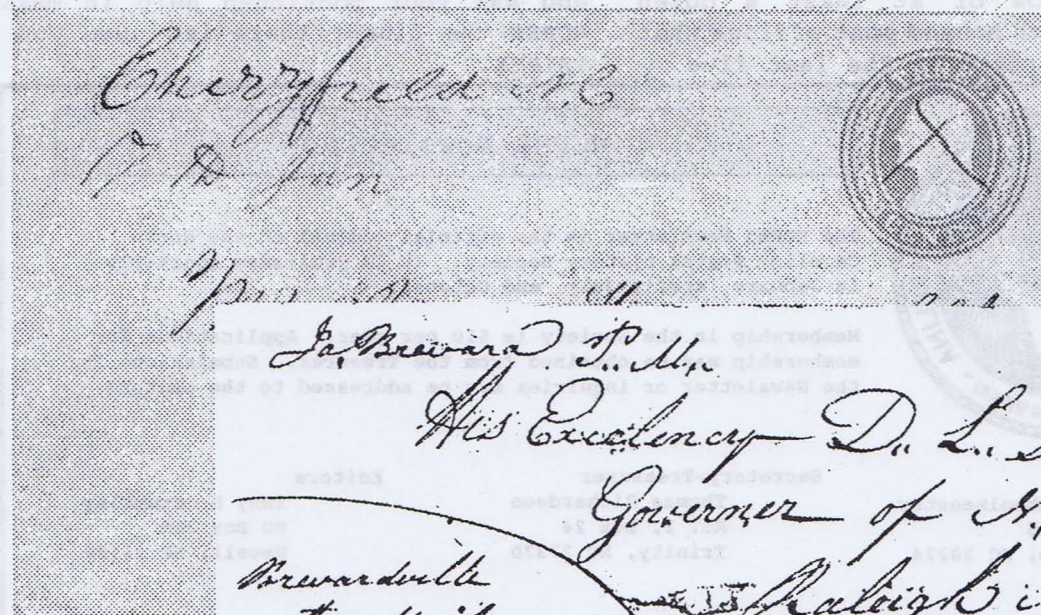

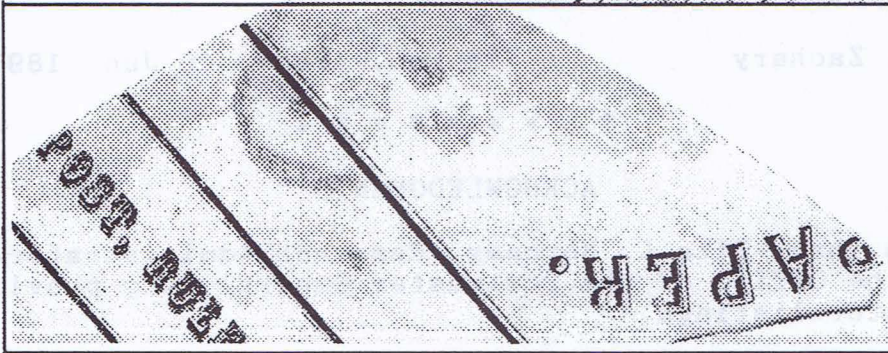

IN THE MARKET PLACE

(Editors comments: Several issues back, the editors requested a volunteer to be the NCPHS's eyes and ears of the NC philatelic market place. With this issue we would like to give you a sample article; see if you like the concept and perhaps round up someone who would like to take on the task of doing this on some regular basis. Should you desire to take on the task, let us know; the pay is outstanding and is totally tax exempt!)

In recent months the philatelic market has brought on some nice North Carolina items, most of which have brought their expected high prices as the supply of covers gets smaller and the number of collectors gets larger. As expected, we have seen some record breaking prices. The Kelleher Sale of February 1989 saw a record set for a NC stampless cover - the heart shaped Leo N.C. was hammered down in excess of \$1,200! I am told that the agent who purchased the cover was prepared to go as high as \$6,000! This set the pace for other scarce stampless markings. A recent private treaty offering included the straight line WASHINGTON N.C. of 1788; the asking price was \$1,850.

One would expect record prices to have been set in the Christie's Sale of October 13, 1989 which was the Weill Brothers stock of Confederate States. This, however, was not the case. Many of the rare provisionals did not sell because they did not meet the owners minimums. Most of the North Carolina items included within this sale did in fact go at considerable higher prices than estimated.

On the upper end items, a LENOIR N.C. Confederate Provisional, 49X1 used on a Davenport Female College cover trimmed into the corner card, sold for \$4,620 against a catalogue value of \$10,000. A fine copy of this same provisional off cover with a small thin sold for \$1,320 against an estimated \$600.

The Raleigh postmaster provisionals were abundant in this sale. Two used on advertising covers brought top

dollar. One particularly attractive cover with a Raleigh Garden & Nursery corner card sold for \$1,320 against an \$800 estimate. The other advertising cover was an all-over design NY Book Store, which was an ex-Casparly, sold for \$605. Four additional Raleigh PMP's ranged from a 'no sale' to a high of \$330.

The only other NC provisional in this sale was a crudely repaired Salem 5¢, 73XU1, which was hammered down at \$176. It was quite a bargain even in this condition, considering less than 12 copies exist of this marking.

There was also a nice run of Carolina City, N.C. handstamp paid covers. Considering the number of these covers which exist, they brought rather hefty prices. The first lot sold for \$462 against an estimate of \$150; the other three sold for \$253, \$154 and \$77.

Perhaps the bargain of the sale were two handstamped covers which were unlisted in the Dietz catalog. The first was a Company Shop/N.C., Due 5 which sold for \$44, and the other was a Morganton/N.C., Paid 10 in blue-green which sold for \$60.50.

Two patriotic covers, the first was of the Mounted Dragoons design, with a Jefferson, N.C., Due 10, plus a Greensboro cds forwarding handstamp. This attractive cover sold for \$275. The other was a 12-Star Flag-and-Cannon design with a Raleigh Due 10 handstamp, which sold for \$440 against an estimated \$200.

Three additional N.C. covers rounded out this sale. A #11a, 10¢ milky blue, tied by a bold OXFORD/N.C. and forwarded by a 10¢ blue #11 from WELDON/N.C. sold for \$176 against an estimated \$80. Two #12's on wallpaper covers which included HILLSBORO/N.C. and a DAVIDSON COLLEGE/N.C. sold for \$187 and \$242 respectively.

This sale seems to indicate that the collectors market for N.C. Postal History remains strong. Nice mid-range covers continue to bring high prices and the high end items remain somewhat flat. In reviewing the material offered at World Expo in Washington, what little N.C. items that were available bore out this fact.
